Technology Tip # 2

Do you have a computer in your classroom?

Do you teach a subject with lots of new vocabulary?

Do you teach spelling?

If you answered yes to any of the questions above then you could be using your computer screen saver to assist you.

- Just right click on your desktop and click on properties.
- Click on screen saver.
- Click on marquee.
- Slow down the speed.
- Click on settings.
- Type the words you want to have scrolling across your computer screen when it isn't in use.
- Make any other adjustments to the fonts color, size, etc.
- Set the wait time and click ok to save your settings.

Now you will have the key vocabulary or spelling words scrolling throughout the day as a constant reminder.

Things to consider:


- You may need to have approval from your administrator prior to introducing a pet into your classroom.
